

Delivering project value

Exploring the true cost of project administration

A cynic, according to Oscar Wilde's famous definition, is someone who knows the cost of everything and the value of nothing. By that same measure, more and more project managers are in danger of becoming cynics – and it's current corporate practice that is making them so.

Status reports and reconciliations; weekly updates to the PMO; numbers to the project board and a paper to the executive committee. In their zeal for better governance, companies are placing so many demands for project and program information that beleaguered project managers end up knowing not just the cost, but also the current status of everything.

In theory, that might seem a benefit. But in practice, it means that project managers become little more than a funnel for information, and the very act of reporting evolves into something self-defeating. The data is there, in black, white and sometimes red, but having spent all their time compiling it, the project managers have had no time to act upon it.

As a result, it's only when completing the weekly report that the project manager spots a deadline missed, or a cost threshold exceeded. It's only when updating the risk register that it becomes apparent that a particular task is going off the rails. A working process or an all-consuming burden?

Some would claim this is evidence of a governance process that works: the critical issues are captured. But a more challenging perspective would argue that this is an opportunity missed; could these problems have been pre-empted and potentially avoided, had the project manager been able to focus on the true task of managing, instead of mere monitoring?

So where's the middle ground here? Clearly, the need to gather and share this project information is of real value to the business: without effective tools and processes for doing so, the project manager is reliant on instinct and good faith. But if the act of reporting itself becomes all-consuming, then the value of doing it evaporates.

The automated alternative

Consider then an alternative scenario, where reporting is automated. The business sets its requirements in advance, right down to producing templates for different reporting formats and audiences; the necessary information is recorded as part of everyday operations, in project plans, workflow and timesheets. Then, each week or where required each day, a report – or suite of reports – arrive in the project manager's inbox: fully formatted, readily analyzed, easily shared.

In this scenario, instead of spending their hours acquiring the necessary information, project managers can devote more time to reviewing it. They can spot ahead of time that a particular workstream is in danger of falling behind schedule, and take action to get it back on track. They can identify where a task is eating up its allotted resources fast, and investigate why.

Add in automated alerts around specific risks, and the project manager's ability to respond – to *manage* – proactively soars.

For the business, the benefits are immense. Not only is the project manager's own time put to better use – after all, what company really wants to pay someone \$68,000 a year to format some data each week? – but projects themselves run far more smoothly. Costs are controlled; contingencies addressed; risks avoided. Equally importantly, manual errors are cut out: while we all understand that, in all that paperwork, there's a chance of a typo slipping in as the project manager exhaustedly enters the same figures for the umpteenth time, it's something the business can well do without.

Even in an organization where the reporting burden is comparatively small, the potential savings from automation are impressive. Automating change management

Of course, status reporting is far from the only administrative task that project managers face. There's the time spent preparing estimates and invoices, engaging contractors, updating project plans when scope changes. All of these too can be automated to real business advantage.

The latter case is a perfect example. A single change to a single task can affect Gantt charts, workflow, dozens of individual and team task lists and a host of related materials – across not just one project, but an entire portfolio. In a large and fluid program, managers might find themselves updating the master schedule almost daily, while other documents quickly become outdated, unless the business is prepared to invest the time and resource in making sure they are all correct. But down the line, a team is unaware of how their workload has changed – and so has not prepared for it. The result: further changes are necessitated and delays created.



If instead that entire process is centralized and automated, as KeyedIn[™] Projects enables it to be, then every project document becomes linked. That one change to the master schedule is automatically replicated across all of the related materials. Instead of requiring the project manager to inform every team of what's changed, team task lists are updated automatically, meaning they can plan ahead. The impact and cost of those changes is absorbed and minimized.

From cost to value

So again, let's look at the bottom line. If managing changes takes an hour of a project manager's time a week, automating just that process of updating project documentation can halve that time – equating to a saving of nearly three days a year.

What's more, there's also a saving on the delivery side. If we assume that prioritizing, reprioritizing and dealing with changes takes an hour a week here too (a conservative estimate), the use of KeyedIn Projects to automate the process – essentially, meaning that the admin side of this is done for delivery teams – is estimated to save around three days a year, per person. The bigger the team, the greater the saving.

But to return to where we began, it's not just a question of costs and time savings: what matters is the value that delivers. Instead of spending a chunk of their days shuffling priorities, project teams are able to focus all their efforts on the task in hand. And that means a greater likelihood of the project being delivered on time, on budget and to the client's satisfaction.
